PROSPECTUS

DON BOSCO (1815-1888)

Don Bosco was born on the 16th of August 1815, in Becchi, a hamlet belonging to the municipality of Castelnuovo d’Asti (today Castelnuovo Don Bosco) in Turin, Italy. He came from a family of poor farmers. He lost his father, Francesco, at the age of two but he drew strength from his mother Margherita’s deep faith in God.

At the age nine, he had a prophetic dream in which a number of unruly young boys were uttering words of blasphemy. Jesus Christ and the Virgin Mary appeared to John in the dream, saying he would bring such youths to God through the virtues of humility and charity.

Later on, this dream would help John to discern his calling as a priest. John’s older brother Anthony opposed his plan to be a priest, and antagonized him so much that he left home to become a farm worker at age 12. After moving back home three years later, John worked in various trades and finished school in order to attend seminary.

In 1841, John Bosco was ordained a priest. From that time, John was known as “Don” Bosco, a traditional Italian title of honor for priests. In the city of Turin, he began ministering to boys and young men who lived on the streets, many of whom were without work or education. He was determined to save as many young people as he could from a life of degradation. He established a group known as the Oratory of St. Francis de Sales, and became a spiritual father

to boys in need. His aging mother helped support the project in its early years. He became a spiritual guide and provider along with his fellow Salesian priests and brothers, giving boys religious instruction, lodging, education, and work opportunities. He also helped Saint Mary Dominic Mazzarello form a similar group for girls.

St. John Bosco died in the early hours of Jan. 31, 1888, after conveying a message: "Tell the boys that I shall be waiting for them all in Paradise." He was canonized on Easter Sunday of 1934, and is a patron saint of young people, apprentices, and Catholic publishers and editors.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE SCHOOL

History of Mithra School

Noticing the deplorable state of poor children in the slums of Horamavu in Bangalore who were working as bonded labourers and rolling incenses sticks, a well-educated couple dreamed together of providing quality education to the poor people in this locality. That dream of theirs is the Mithra School which became a reality.

Mr. Rosario with a PhD in Clinical Psychology from NIMHANS, and his wife Mrs. Elizabeth, fondly called 'Bella' who worked as the coordinator for HOPCOMS in Tamil Nadu and Kerala.

This couple's dream started becoming a reality in 1995 when they initially put up a small shed in Muneshwara village to enable the slum children to attend classes.

"Dreams are not what you see in your sleep, dreams are things which do not let you sleep". With these inspirational words as their moto, this committed couple worked relentlessly for the

welfare and integral development of the slum dwellers so as to make their dream a reality..

Dr. Rosario and Mrs. Bella, after they realized their dream of setting up the school and running it for a few years. Since, with passage of time, Age combined with demands of the Government and Education System, compelled them to search for other partners in taking forward their dream. Eventually they concluded that the Congregation of the Salesians of Don Bosco would be the most suitable partners who could be entrusted with the responsibility of this school.



RULES OF THE SCHOOL

- No students will be allowed to leave the school campus during the school hours except on the strength of a letter of authorization from his / her parent / guardian.
- If any student leaves during school hours they should obtain prior permission from the school authority and class teacher and have to leave a note/ reason in the 'Students movement register'.
- Students should address their teachers and all the members of the school staff with respect and politeness.
- On their way to and from school, students must behave well.
- Fancy and curious items and electronic gadgets (Mobile phones, cameras, music players, tattoos, video games, CDs, toys, digital diaries, calculators, etc.) must not be brought to the school.
- Damage done by the student to school property will have to

be made good by him/her. Classrooms should be kept tidy and attractive. Scribbling on furniture or on walls is strictly forbidden.

- The class monitors and prefects should ensure that lights and fans are switched off when it is not necessary or leaving the classrooms. Bins must be used appropriately for waste paper etc.
- The transition between teacher leaving the class and the other arriving is not the time for idle talk or creating disturbance. Await the teacher's arrival in silence and stand up and wish when he/ she enters the classroom.
- Students should be clean and tidy in their person and dress, take pride in their personal appearance, maintain proper body cleanliness, respectful and obliging to their elders and companions. In the classrooms, besides paying attention to cleanliness and personal bearing, they should create and maintain an atmosphere conducive to serious study.
- All students should come to school on time, as specified by the principal from time to time. Habitual late coming may lead to asking the student to go back home without attending school. Punctuality and discipline should be the watchwords of every student. Report on time and be brisk in your walk.
- Bad behaviour or use of rough, rude and abusive language is prohibited both inside or outside the school premises. Bad conduct will be a just cause for dismissal from school.
- Running, playing, jumping on furniture, yelling and shouting inside the class rooms and corridors are not allowed.
- Crowding in the corridors or entering other class rooms is

strictly prohibited.

- No books, periodicals, comics, newspapers or printed matters of objectionable nature must be brought to the school. All printed materials (except those mentioned in the school book list) when brought into the school must be presented to the Principal for approval, and may be retained in the school and read if they bear the signature of the school authorities.
- Students are responsible for the safe custody of their own books and belongings. Each article must be marked with the student's name.
- Every student is expected to subscribe towards small school shows and local charities, if requested by the Principal. However, no collections or fines or funds are to be made in the school without a written permission or notice from the Principal.
- In all matters of promotion or failure, the Principal's decision is final.
- Every student attending school is obliged to take part in curricular activities organized by the school.
- Students are not allowed to bring motor bikes.
- **Students must speak only in English in the school campus.**

REGULARITY RECORD

(ABSENCE, LEAVE, DELAY)

- Absentees on the first day of re-opening will be fined.
- Leave of absence is not given without a prior written application from the parent / guardian stating the reason, which must be a valid one.

- Reasons for absence due to unforeseen circumstances even if only for a day or due to sickness which may exceed two or three days must also be stated in a letter (from a doctor or from the parent / guardian) besides being entered briefly in the Regularity Record Under ‘Absent’. Reasons of a private nature may always be submitted in a letter.
- If an unauthorized absence from school exceeds 15 calendar days, the student’s name may be struck off the rolls and he may not be re-admitted to school.
- A leave granted must be recorded in the ‘Absence Record’ in the calendar.
- Late arrival in the school is a breach of discipline. A student who comes late to the school must enter the time of arrival in the ‘Late attendance Record’. Those are to be signed by the parents when they get back home.
- Late arrivals may be penalized each time with a fine or some other suitable penalty.
- Students who come late to school habitually may be fined or sent back home or both.
- Re-admission to class for absentees and late comers is granted when they can show the teacher in charge the ‘Absence Record’ duly countersigned by the Principal.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

- Every student must wear clean and proper uniform daily; defaulters may be fined or sent back.
- The permission to attend school without proper uniform must be obtained on the Regularity Record under uniform.

DRESS CODE

- Shirts to be tucked in, buttoned and not be oversized.
- Skirts should be below the knee.
- Blazers to be worn every day.
- Sleeveless, 3/4th, Slippers and all types of offensive dresses should be avoided.
- Only school shoes are allowed
- Socks must be visible above the shoes, ought to wear only school socks.
- No fancy spectacle frames or tinted spectacles.
- No tinted contact lenses.

GIRLS

- No rings, necklaces, bracelets, bands and nose – studs or nose rings.
- No other accessories are allowed.
- No looped earrings except small ear studs.
- No make-up, plucking of eye-brows.
- Finger nails to be trimmed.

BOYS

- No earrings / Ear studs
- No ear- Sticks, Clean shaven
- Finger nails to be trimmed.

HAIR STYLE

GIRLS

- Hair style should be tidy and not tousled.
- No tinting or coloring.

- Long hair (below shoulder-length) must be plaited in two and tied using black ribbons.
- Fringe should be neatly pinned up and not to cover the eye brows.

BOYS

- Hair to be trimmed at regular intervals and to be maintained.
- No sideburns / step cut / punk / spiky / outlandish styles.
- No shaved heads except on medical grounds.

FOR PARENTS / GUARDIANS

- Parents retain their right and duties in the education of their children, even though they delegate them in part to the school. The support and collaboration of parents are in all cases considered indispensable to the success of the work of education carried out by the school.
- Parents / Guardians are requested to co-operate with school authorities.
 - a. By using their wards to be regular and punctual in attendance.
 - b. By not engaging private tutors without consulting the school authorities.
 - c. By seeing that their wards are diligent at their homework and lessons.
 - d. By insisting on neatness and cleanliness in the text books, exercise book and personal appearance.
 - e. By occasionally meeting the Principal/teachers to discuss the progress of their wards.
- Periodical records and report book will keep parents / guardians

informed of the progress of their wards. These reports are to be signed and returned on time, as given in the hand book.

- Ordinarily communication with parents / Guardians is made through the handbook. On the first day of every month handbook must be checked by the parents and the class teacher.
- Parents / Guardians are not permitted to see their wards or meet teachers during the class hours without the prior permission of the Principal.
- Admittance into the school premises is at the sole discretion of the school authorities, who reserve to themselves the right to refuse admission to anyone without assigning any reason whatsoever.
- Parents are requested not to send wards with any hanging ear rings or chains made of gold as it might invite anti-social elements on the way, or your ward may lose them in the school or on the way.
- Communication through SMS, Website and school notice boards are official.
- School will not be responsible for the vehicle that is parked in school compound.
- The school fee can be paid in three installments at the beginning of each trimester.
- All communication to the school should be addressed to the Principal. If the communication is regarding a pupil of the school, the parents are expected to write clearly on the top, the pupil's name, class, section and the registration number.
- The handbook has to be read very carefully by the parent and should be signed after reading it.

- The students shall be shuffled every year for the better of the students and to balance the class.

PRIVATE TUTION

- As a policy, the School forbids all private tuitions, as a pupil should be able to progress in his / her work as a result of good teaching.
- **Kindly note that no teacher of our school is allowed to tutor a child who is in our school.**
